Q - What time is Mass on a Sunday? Α - 09:00. The Children's Church meets at the same time. There is a Thursday morning communion service at 10:00 every other Thursday. Special services are held during Lent, easter and Christmas. Q - Is there secure parking at the church? Α - There is safe, off-road parking and easy access for the disabled. Q - What Liturgy do you use? Α - The Common Worship Services for the Church of England. Q - As a traditional Anglican congregation, under whose authority are you?

- Q What music do you have?
- We chiefly use traditional English church music of all kinds. We have a pipe organ and our organist is a member of the Royal School of Church Music.
- Q Do you have a Youth group?
- A Yes, they meet in the hall on a Friday evening.
- Q What sort of people worship at St Andrew's?
- A We are broadly representative of all South African communities.
- Q Who is on your staff?
- A At present we have one Priest, a Deacon, two lay ministers and an active Servers' Guild.
- Q Does your parish participate in any outreach programmes?
- A Our Works of Mercy team ministers to a many needy people in the area for whom we both budget and collect groceries. There is also a midweek Bible Study via the internet and a prison ministry.
- Q How do I join the parish?
- Start by coming to services, introduce yourself, and complete a membership form when you are ready to commit to the parish. There is always room for another sinner. We regard our parish as a hospital for sinners, rather than a cosy club for the smug. We are traditional but not stodgy.
